Taking Action on Plastic Pollution

Plastic pollution is a globally significant issue that impacts the environment, human health, and the economy. Plastic ends up in our landfills, litters our parks and beaches, and pollutes our rivers, lakes, and oceans. Small particles of plastic have become pervasive in our environment, and people and wildlife are exposed through air, water, and food.

To protect human health, safeguard the environment, and grow the economy, we are taking action to reduce plastic pollution. On January 30th 2020, our Government released the Draft Science Assessment of Plastic Pollution, which provides us with evidence detailing the extent of the plastic pollution problem in Canada.

The Assessment reviews the available scientific information regarding the impact of plastic pollution on the environment and human health while confirming that larger plastic items like bags and straws harm animals and negatively affect their habitat. The report also highlights how microplastic



pollution is negatively affecting animals and the environment, while uncertainty remains regarding the potential effects on humans. We will further our understanding of the human health impacts of plastic pollution with further research to address this gap. Most importantly, the Assessment will help inform our Government's actions and policies as we follow through on our commitment to ban harmful single-use plastics.

As our Government continues to implement its ambitious climate action plan, we are working to have new regulations on plastic use in place as early as 2021, including moving towards a ban on single-use plastics by the end of next year. This Assessment provides the evidence base to list harmful plastic pollutants under the Canadian Environmental Protection Act so that they can be regulated.

Our actions will work in concert with communities across the riding that have already taken ambitious action to combat plastic use. Municipalities like West Vancouver and the Sunshine Coast Regional District are petitioning the BC Government for jurisdictional rights to implement single-use plastic bans. Meanwhile, Squamish has already implemented a plastic reduction program, while Gibsons has moved towards doing the same.

Local communities are already taking action on this issue, demonstrating once again how British Columbia is leading on this and other important environmental initiatives.
